The Master of Science (MS) in Nursing (Emphasis in Strategic Systems Leadership) contains 30 credits. For those who already have a master's degree in nursing but are interested in strategic systems leadership, or for those who are interested in sampling the specialization prior to earning their master's degree, there is an option to enroll in the Graduate Certificate in Strategic Systems Leadership. The graduate certificate is priced at \$6,653 for 12 credits (4 classes), all of which can be transferred to the 30 credits for the master's degree. How To Apply

Applicants must fulfill certain requirements for admission:

- Applicants must have a bachelor's degree in nursing from an accredited program
 or an associate's degree in nursing from an accredited program with a bachelor's
 degree in another field.
- For applicants with an associate's degree in nursing and a bachelor's degree in another field:
 - Completion of undergraduate public health nursing (theory and clinical) course(s) and nursing research (didactic) passed with a grade of "B" or better is required.
 - And either:
 - Completion of an undergraduate introduction to statistics course from a college or university with a grade of "C" or better, or a "Pass." Another option is completion of a graduate course in statistics, passed with a "B" grade or higher, and completed prior to enrollment in NUR 530.

Or:

- Completion of undergraduate courses in nursing research (didactic) and public health nursing (didactic and clinical) with grades of "B" or better.
- A minimum 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale is required in all nursing coursework for the baccalaureate program or the associate degree in nursing program. If the applicant's GPA is below 3.0, students may be given provisional admission.
- Applicants must have a current RN license in good standing to practice as an RN in Arizona (or your state of residence/employment); eligibility to obtain an Arizona license; or meet the Arizona Board of Nursing regulations regarding multistate licensure.
- Due to State Board of Nursing and other legal requirements, we do not accept students into the program that live in AL, TN, WA, American Samoa, Northern Mariana Islands, Guam, Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands, nor are we permitted to allow students to complete the program if they relocate to one of these states.
